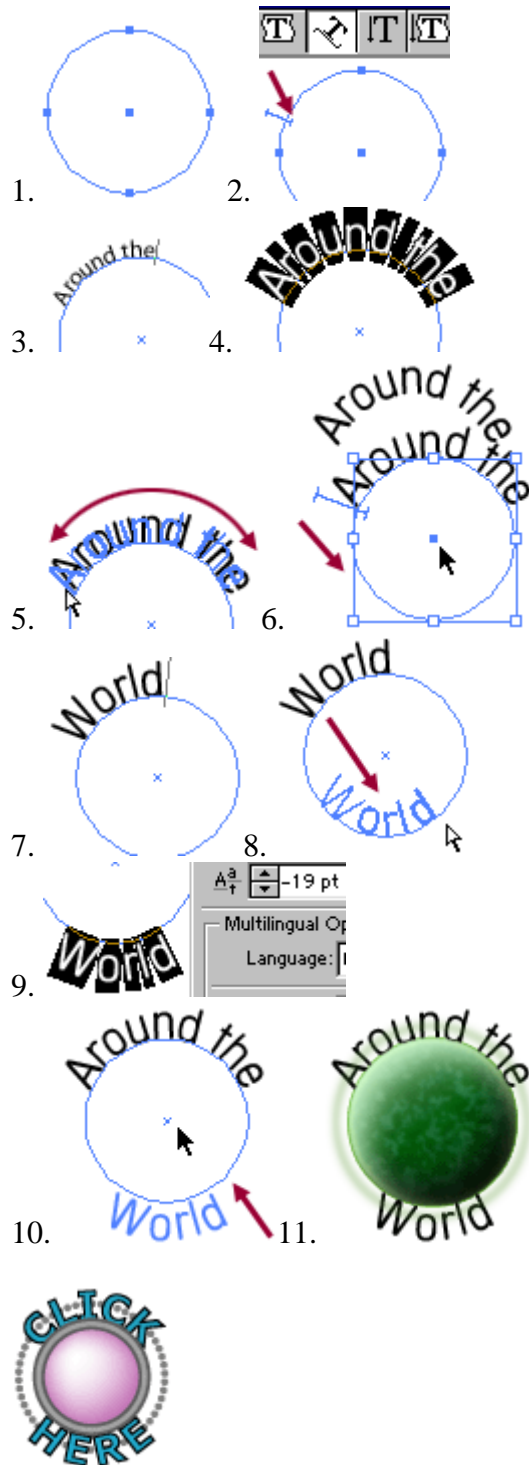


Text Around a Circle

1. Select the Ellipse tool from your Toolbar or by pressing "L" on your keyboard. Hold down the Shift key on your keyboard and draw a circle with the Ellipse tool. Select the circle, then click + Alt + Drag to create a duplicate circle. Move this circle out of the way - you will not need it until the end of the tutorial.
2. Select the Path Type Tool and click anywhere on the circumference of the circle you just created. The circle will turn into a blue outlined circle with an I-beam on it.
3. Wherever you click on the circle will mark the beginning of your text. If you have a small circle, it's best to keep the point size of the text small in order to give the text a smoother curve. Type 'Around the'.
4. If the point size of the text is too large simply double click on it, click and drag to select all the text, then change the font size in the Character palette.
5. To position the text in a certain position first select the Selection tool (Press "V"), then click on the text. Click on the I-beam that appears and drag it around the circle as shown.
6. With the Selection tool click + Alt + Drag to create a duplicate of this object. TIP: Let go of the mouse button before the Alt key - or the duplication will not work.
7. Working on the second Path Type object, double click the text on the path. Highlight it and then change it to say 'World'.
8. With the Selection tool click on the word. When the I-beam appears, click on it and drag the text to the center-bottom of the circle.
9. Now we need to move the text below the path. In the Character palette, enter a negative value for the Baseline-shift. Start with -12 pt, if this adds much distance, increase



the number (i.e. -8 pt). If the word has not moved enough and is intersecting the path, decrease the number (i.e. -30 pt).

10. With the Selection tool, click and drag the '*World*' path and position it over the '*Around the*' path - lining up the circles.
11. But there's no visible circle! Take the circle - copied way back when - fill it, stroke it, jazz it up. Then select it, move it, and line it up with the circle of the path type.
